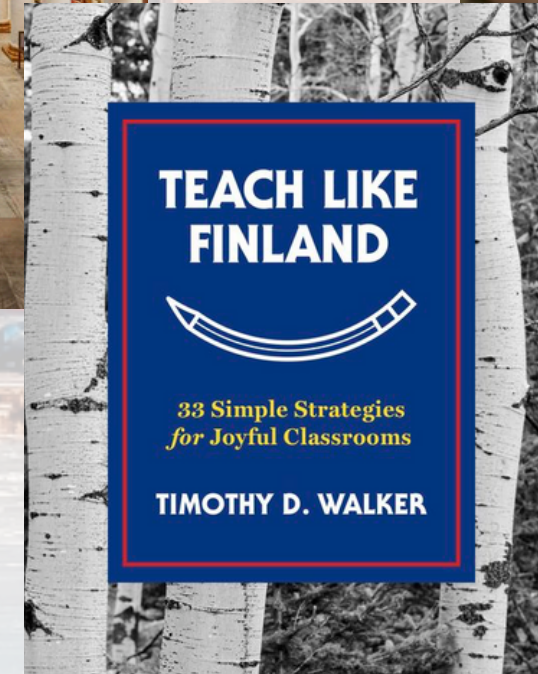
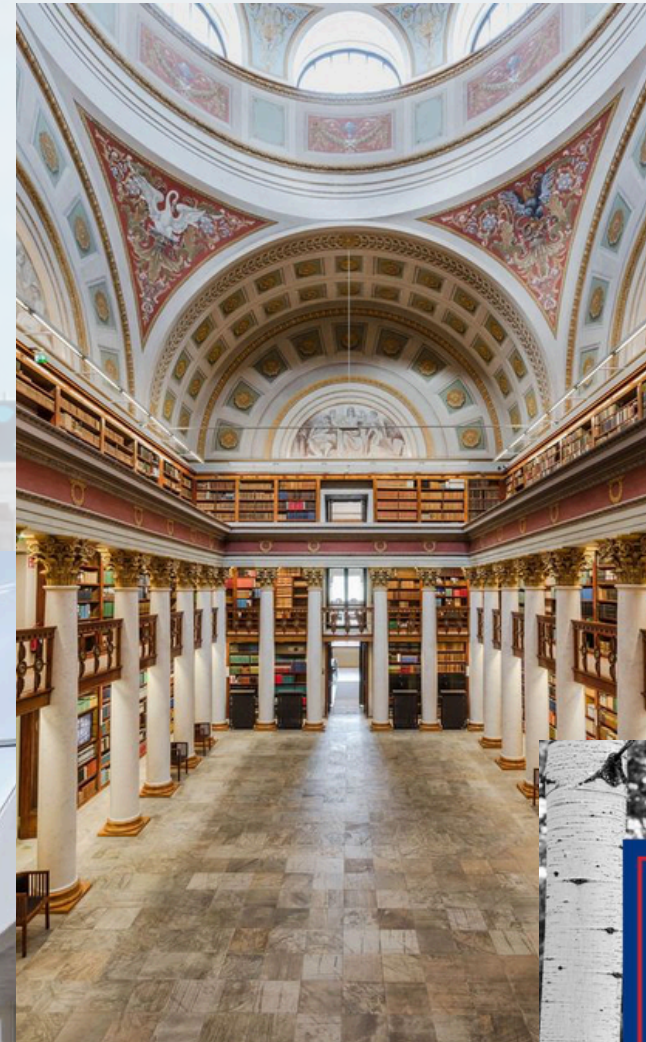
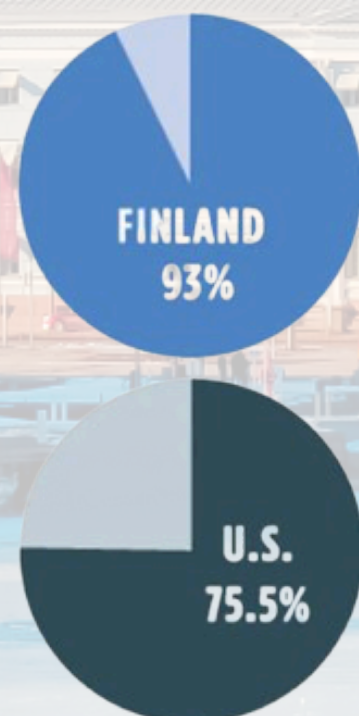


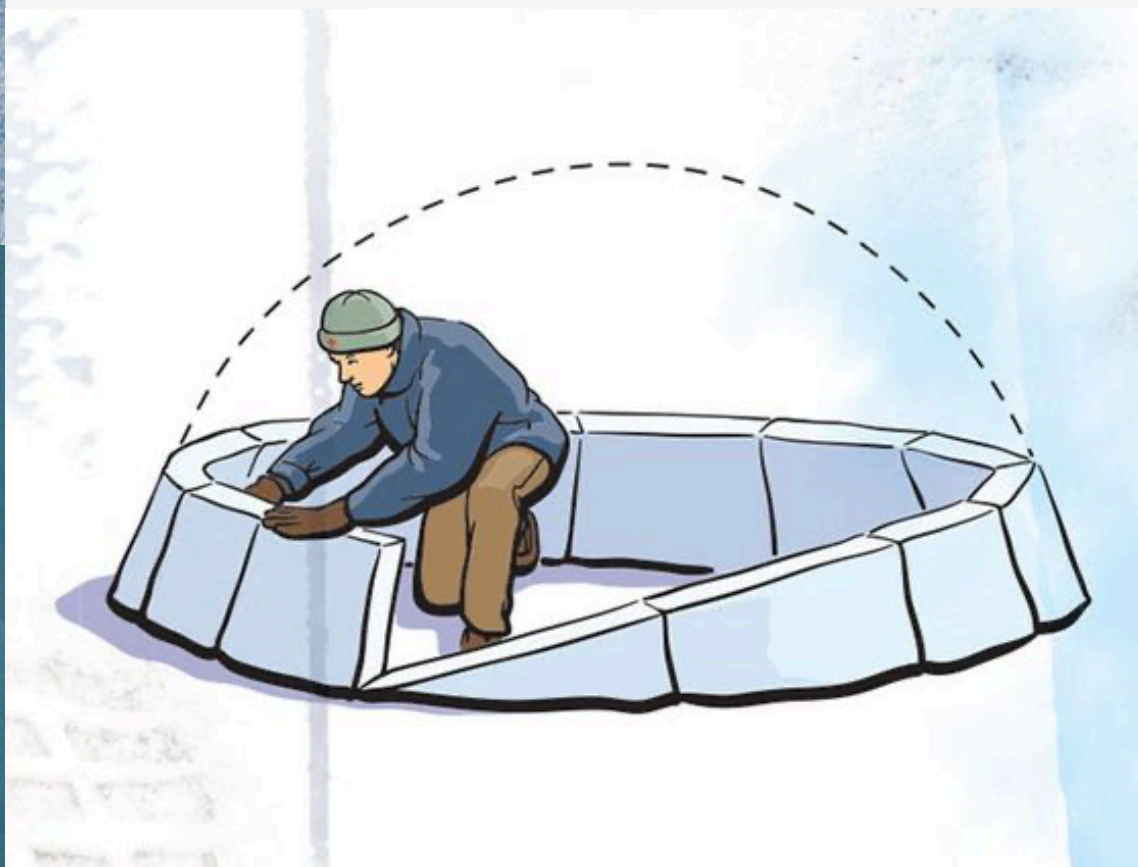
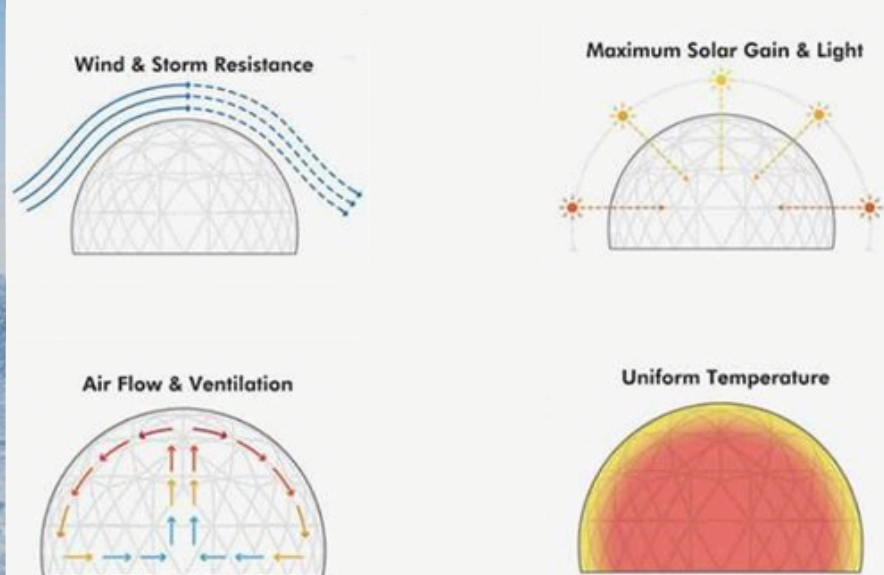


Finland is becoming more diverse due to immigration, even though it has a historically homogeneous culture.

Percentage of high school students who graduate

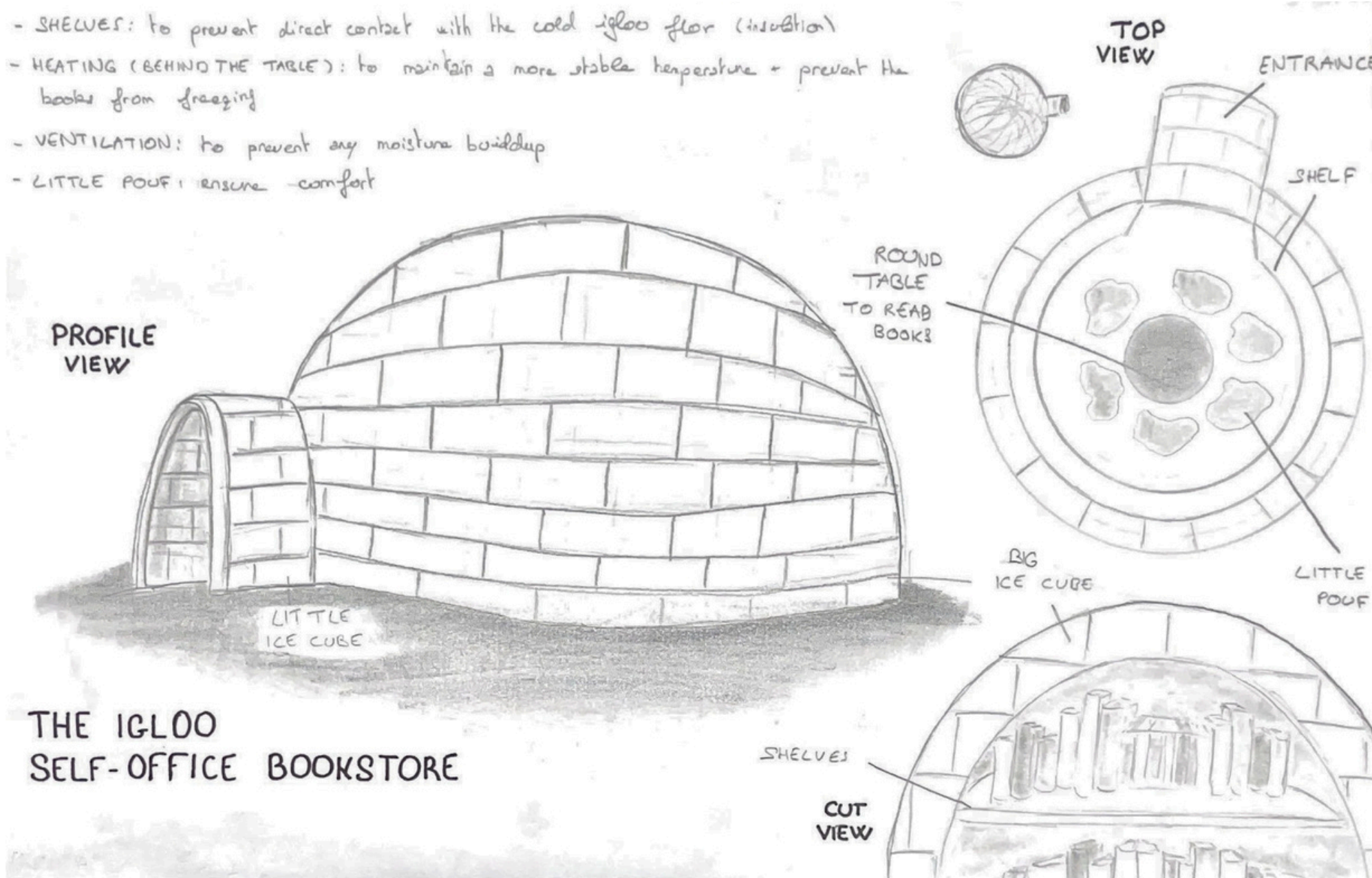

To create these models :

1. I used a cardboard base covered with cotton.
2. I placed marshmallows to form the shape of the igloo, then covered them with cotton for a snowy effect.
3. I built the entrance and a small shelf using cardboard.
4. To make the scene more realistic, I added books and two beanbag chairs.
